

## FREON PHASEOUT

What Every Homeowner Should Know

- As of January 2020, the Environmental Protection Agency has banned the production and importation of Freon, also known as R-22, which is used in many home's AC units. Puron (R410A) is replacing Freon.
- The production of R-22 HVAC units and parts stopped in 2015.
- Using Freon is NOT illegal, nor do you need to pro-actively replace your HVAC unit. It will likely be more expensive for you when your R-22 HVAC unit needs to be repaired.
- If your Freon condenser needs to be replaced, it must be replaced with a Puron condensor. Freon components are not typically compatible with Puron, therefore the coil or air handler would also need to be replaced.
- The retail cost (without proper coverage) of upgrading a coil or air handler to be Puron compatible is \$1,200-\$2,500 per component.
